On the insurance side, I know there have been some issues with prescriptions and the pharmacies telling members they must meet a deductible before the insurance will begin to cover them. **THAT IS INCORRECT!** We <u>DO NOT</u> have a deductible for any In-Network prescriptions or pharmacies. The Company has been made aware of the issue and they are working to resolve it. If you are told that you have a deductible when you try to pick up a prescription please have the pharmacy rerun the script with UHC. If that does not resolve the issue have the pharmacy call UHC, while you are present, to confirm coverage and to get the correct coverage information. If you are still unable to get it resolved, please contact me at the Union Hall and I will assist you with getting it resolved. Please follow this process as it is the only way to get the issue taken care of, per the Global Benefits representative for the Company.

For any of the new hires that have recently become eligible for healthcare coverage and are having any issues with it please contact me at the Union Hall. I know there has been some confusion on the timing of coverage and Alight telling members they have to pay a premium. Once you are eligible for coverage there are no premiums or deductibles for the member or dependents.

In closing, February 11th with mark the 85th anniversary of the end of the sit-down strike that created recognition of the UAW for the first time at General Motors in Flint, MI. In honor of those individuals, we wear white shirts on this day, attire usually worn by management, to say Thank You to those men and women for bringing recognition of the middle-class and workers' rights.
