### President's Report

I have had a few members ask questions on "Prior Authorizations" and "GAP Exceptions" on the medical side of our healthcare coverage so I'd like to address those here. A "Prior Authorization" is the approval from UnitedHealthcare of a specific procedure(s). This means the procedure(s) will be covered by UnitedHealthcare as an in-network procedure. A "Prior Authorization" can be granted for an in-network facility or out-ofnetwork facility. It is the members responsibility to make sure the facility and the doctor performing the procedure will also be covered by UnitedHealthcare. A "GAP Exception" would come in to play when a member is seeking to have a procedure or visit with a doctor or facility that is considered out-of-network. The member and their doctor would need to go through the process of applying for a "GAP Exception". UnitedHealthcare would typically check the network of doctors and facilities under our coverage to see if it is something that can be addressed with an in-network doctor or facility first. They will also check to see if the procedure(s) being requested are clinically proven and FDA approved or if they are still in the experimental or trial stage. This is where the doctor requesting the "GAP Exception" would need to give as much detailed information as possible on why the service being requested is medically necessary. As always, it is the members responsibility to make sure any service they are having is covered at the in-network level by contacting UnitedHealthcare at the number on the back of the insurance card. If you have any questions about either of these feel free to contact me at the Union Hall.

Just a reminder to those members currently on IAW's for the Summer Shutdown at Seeding, if you have any questions about filing for unemployment, please contact IDES. Unfortunately, the Union no longer has a direct contact with IDES, so we are unable to assist with any of the process.
