# **JOBS TO MOVE AMERICA**

In July UAW members gathered with other Union members for the Grand Opening Event of Lion's Electric at their new manufacturing facility in Joliet, Illinois. Labor groups, workers, and Joliet and Will County community members are fighting to win a community benefits agreements with Lion Electric.

The Canadian manufacturer of electric school buses will benefit from millions of dollars in public money in addition to tax breaks. Since opening production in Joliet, Lion has been hiring workers through a temporary staffing agency, not providing adequate training, and paying wages similar to Amazon warehouses.

UAW Region 4 stands with Good Jobs Joliet Coalition calling on Lion to negotiate a CBA that ensures:

- 1). A fair process for workers to choose a union
- 2). High-quality training that allows workers to do their jobs safely, earning industry-recognized credentials
- 3). A community hiring program targeting groups facing barriers to good manufacturing jobs including women, people of color, and the formerly incarcerated.

From Director Campbell on site at the Lion facility: "United Auto Workers is committed to making all auto manufacturing jobs good jobs. As the EV transition ramps up, it's unacceptable to see these new companies like Lion Electric come in, receive millions in tax breaks, and fail to do the right thing for communities and workers."

#### **VOTER POWER UNDER ATTACK IN MISSOURI**

Since 1820, constitutional amendments have required just a simple majority of votes cast for ratification in Missouri. This constitutional right prevented Right to Work from becoming MO law in 2018 by will of the people. In attempt to limit voter power, the MO House has recently passed HJR 43 to raise the ratification threshold from simple majority to 57 percent. This initiative is happening concurrently across the United States in Republican-led State Legislatures. Ohio just succeeded in turning down this ballot measure in a special election, securing their simple majority for ratification. The MO Senate did not pass the legislation as the May session ended, but it will certainly be back the next session for consideration. Missouri voters on alert!



## **IOWA KIDS ARE NOT FOR SALE**

In February UAW lowa State CAP joined union workers across the state of lowa in Des Moines to protest the loosening of child labor laws. Efforts in several states are led by Republican Legislators to address worker shortages. Child welfare advocates and labor leaders remain concerned that hard-won protections for minors are being diminished, as according to data from the U.S. Labor Department, child labor violations have been increasing since 2015. Investigators of the Wage and Labor Division are finding more children working in dangerous jobs, including meatpacking and metal shops. Senator Nate Boulton and other lowa CAP supported Legislators are planning to enhance education and fact sheets so that parents and employers can make better decisions about teenagers' employment in the state, revisiting state and federal laws for consistency in the next session.

# ILLINOIS: LABOR FRIENDLY BILLS TO ACTION!

#### Bill Number: HB3129

Description: Amends the Equal Pay Act by making it unlawful for an employer with 15 or more employees to fail to include the pay scale and benefits for a position in any job posting, including with a third-party.

Action: Signed

Effective: January 1, 2025

#### Bill Number: HB2847

Description: Creates the Mental Health and Wellness Act. Requires insurance coverage for an annual mental health and prevention wellness visit with cost sharing.

Action: Signed

Effective: January 1, 2024

#### Bill Number: SB0761

Description: Creates the EMT Training, Recruitment, and Retention Task Force.

Action: Signed

Effective: Immediately. Pilot program begins July 1st, 2023.

#### Bill Number: HB2443

Description: Requires insurance or managed care plans must offer, for an additional premium, coverage for hearing instruments if prescribed by a hearing care professional.

Action: Signed

Effective: January 1, 2024
