

2024 NATIONAL CAP CONFERENCE

I would first like to apologize for the tardiness of this report. Micheal George and I went to Washington, D.C. to represent West Central and Local 893 CAP. The first day was spent lobbying on the hill and talking to representatives about problems/challenges facing American laborers. The first night we had a key note speaker, Bernie Sanders. He spoke about the union and the push for a 32-hour work week. The second day started off with breakfast, and then we had a group of panelists that were introduced by President Fain as "extraordinary, badass, militant women who inspire him". Congresswoman Rashida Tlaib, AFA-CWA President Sara Nelson, CTU President Stacy Davis Gates, acting Secretary of Labor Julie Su, and Regional Director LaShawn English. We also did more lobbying on the hill and breakout discussion groups. We got to hear from some of the organizing workers from the auto industry at VW and Toyota. Micheal and I attended the progressive breakout discussion group. Later, Shawn Fain was introduced and spoke about the two presidential candidates, and announced the UAW endorsement of Joe Biden for the President of the United States of America.

EV transition has been a hot topic as of late and he said a quote from July of 1970 by Lenoard Woodcock for a UN meeting at Black Lake over the environment. "We will also take to the bargaining table the threat to the jobs of our members as well as to the environment of the continued production of internal combustion engines with their present level of damaging pollutants. We will see concrete assurance that everything possible is being done to produce emission systems that will cease to poison the atmosphere. If this should not seem feasible with present technology, then we shall demand full-scale research, and develop an alternative engine source which will meet necessary social standards".

Our Union needs to keep fighting for new hires, because you once were one; keep fighting for retirees, because you will be one. When we unite as a whole working class, WE CAN WIN. We hold the majority, but it can't be a silent majority. We have the power, but it can't be disorganized. Being part of the discussion instead of just listening to it, is empowering and we need to keep pushing to have our voices heard. Empower yourself by finding your voice and becoming part of the conversation. We must turn ourselves, our families, and our communities from quiet supporters of the cause of social and economic justice, into an army of working-class warriors ready to STAND UP. It was a great experience and thank you for sending us. I highly encourage our membership to get educated, be active, and STAND UP FOR OUR FUTURE.

May 5th June 9th


July 21st
