Greetings UAW Higher Ed Family,

In 2024, recognizing the importance and growth of our higher ed membership in the UAW, the International Executive Board voted to establish a National Higher Education Council, as well as a department to support the work of our higher ed locals. There are over 100,000 higher ed workers who have either joined our union or are organizing to do so. More and more higher ed workers are refusing to accept the status quo and are organizing for a voice in their workplaces. At the same time, higher ed workers — and all workers — face severe threats from the incoming Trump administration. The new Higher Education Council will be an important space to coordinate, share tactics and make national strategies at this critical time.

UAW Higher Education Council will meet in April 2025 (virtual meeting, time/date TBD) and then will hold its first in-person meeting on June 21-22, 2025, at the UAW Region 6 office in Pico Rivera, California.

If UAW members or workers on active UAW organizing campaigns in the higher education sector would like to attend the Council meetings, they should fill out the **meeting registration form**. For the in-person meeting, non-delegates can fill out the form if they are interested in attending and will be notified if space permits.

Process for Electing Council Delegates

Per the Higher Education Council Bylaws, each bargaining unit is allotted delegates and votes to the Higher Education Council based on membership size. See the attachment that includes the number of delegates and votes for each bargaining unit, organized by Local Union.

Eligibility for Delegates: Any unit member in good standing may run to be a delegate for their unit, or as an at-large delegate if their unit has less than 100 members. Presidents of local unions representing workers in higher education are eligible to run as at-large delegates, or as delegates from the higher education unit of which they are a member.

Sub-Councils

The Council meeting will also include meetings of the four Higher Education Sub-Councils

- 1. Student Workers
- 2. Postdocs/Researchers
- 3. University Staff (Non-Academic)
- 4. Faculty.

Where possible, Council delegates shall also serve as designated Sub-Council delegates.

Local unions should elect Council delegates by March 31 so that they can register. Please submit elected Higher Education Council Delegates March 31 at this link.

Higher Education Council Per Capita Dues

Per the Council Bylaws, beginning July 1, 2025, each local union with Higher Education bargaining units should contribute a portion of their monthly dues to fund the activities of the Council. Higher Education Department staff will be in touch with locals regarding Council Dues.
