It is with great pleasure that we issue the Official Call for the 23rd Biennial Convention of the Coalition of Labor Union Women, November 9-11, 2025, at the **Sheraton San Diego Resort Hotel.** The link to make hotel reservations will be posted at CLUW.org as soon as it is available, but no later than July 15.. DO NOT CALL THE HOTEL.

Hotel room rates are \$199.00 per day for single and doubles, \$229.00 for triples, and \$249.00 for quads plus current taxes of 14.95%. The rate is available 3 days before and after the convention, based on availability for all guest rooms. Reservation deadline is October 14, 2025. Anyone interested in finding a roommate to share room costs should contact the National CLUW office. We will assist in making those connections.

Only delegates to the convention will be acting on the business of the convention that will set the future direction for CLUW. Delegates must be a CLUW member in good standing by September 26, 2025.

Please note that observers are welcome to attend the convention and fully participate in all activities. However, they will be required to pay the appropriate registration fee and will be seated in a special section in the convention hall as they will not be able to have a voice or vote. There will be activities outside of the convention that everyone can participate in.

This year's convention will include election of officers, National Executive Board Delegates, and Union delegates. General Election information can be found under Convention Rules, included in this packet. More specific information will be posted online and available in person at the Convention.

We hope you will enjoy this exciting convention that will cover a variety of topics, featuring dynamic speakers and sessions to inspire and empower delegates and guests.

# TWENTIETH-THIRD BIENNIAL CLUW CONVENTION November 9-11, 2025 San Diego, California

## ARTICLE 1. PROCEDURES FOR CONDUCT OF CLUW CONVENTION

### I. ORDER OF BUSINESS

- A. Call to Order.
- B. Appointment of Parliamentarian, two (2) Timekeepers for each session, Sergeants-at-Arms.
- C. Adoption of Rules.
- D. Business of the CLUW Convention (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention").
- E. The business of the Constitution Committee shall take precedence over all other convention business, except elections.
- II. SERGEANTS-AT-ARMS: Sergeants-at-Arms shall keep order at the Convention and shall ascertain that all delegates, observers, guests, and press are seated in their assigned places and that every participant is wearing a convention badge. Sergeants-at-Arms shall be responsible for tabulating roll call votes and collecting fines.

#### III. REGISTERING AND SEATING OF DELEGATES

- A. The Credentials Committee shall register and certify all delegates.
- B. Badges must be worn at all convention sessions and meetings. No one will be admitted to any session of the Convention without a badge.
- C. Seating,
  - 1. Delegates and observers will each be seated in the specially designated sections of the convention room.
  - 2. The placement of delegates will occur prior to the opening of the Convention.
  - 3. Designated areas shall be provided for Union and Chapter delegations.

#### IV. COMMITTEE PROCEDURES

- A. Committees shall function according to the provisions of Article V, Section 5 of the CLUW Constitution.
- B. The following committees shall formally report to the Convention:
  - **1. Rules Committee:** The Rules Committee shall submit proposed rules for the conduct of convention business to the convention body for approval.

#### 2. Credentials Committee:

- a. The Credentials Committee shall decide all questions of certification of delegates.
- b. The Committee shall give a full credentials report to the Convention.



- **3. Resolutions Committee:** Resolutions submitted in a timely manner to the Resolutions Committee, and in full accordance with the Constitution, shall be considered by the Committee.
  - a. The Committee may combine and/or consolidate resolutions having the same intent.
  - b. The Committee may consult, where appropriate, with CLUW standing committees regarding resolutions relevant to the subject matter of those committees.
  - c. The Committee may establish priorities for reporting resolutions to the Convention.
  - d. The Committee shall report on the disposition of all resolutions to the Convention.
  - e. Any resolution submitted in a timely manner and in full accordance with the Constitution but not acted upon by the Convention shall be forwarded to the National Executive Board for disposition.

### 4. Constitution Committee:

- a. There will be two (2) documents concerning the Constitution Committee report. One document will contain those proposed amendments which the Committee is recommending to the Convention for adoption. The other document will contain all proposals submitted to the Committee on a timely basis.
- b. The Committee will present for discussion only those proposals it is recommending to the Convention for adoption. A delegate wishing to bring to the floor a timely submitted constitutional amendment must do so at the appropriate time in the Committee report.
- c. There are two (2) ways in which amendments received timely and in accordance with the Constitution, but not recommended by the Committee, may be introduced:
  - 1) Amendments received timely and in full accordance with the Constitution concerning an article for which changes are proposed by the Committee may be introduced at the time the appropriate article is under consideration by the body.
  - 2) Amendments received timely and in full accordance with the Constitution concerning articles not contained in the Committee's recommendations may be introduced at the end of the final report.
- d. Any amendment which was not submitted on a timely basis and in full accordance with the Constitution shall be allowed if accepted by a 2/3 vote of the Convention body.

#### 5. Elections Committee:

- a. The Elections Committee shall prepare rules for the conduct of all elections to take place at the Convention.
- b. The Committee shall give a report of election results.
- distributed in the convention rooms. Delegates wishing to distribute materials in convention rooms must submit such materials to the CLUW Executive Director at least twenty-four (24) hours in advance of the session at which s/he wishes to distribute such materials. The Executive Director will convene the Rules Committee and the committee will determine if such materials are relevant to convention business and approved for distribution. Any person distributing unauthorized materials will be removed from the room along with the unauthorized materials.



## **ARTICLE 2. PROPOSED RULES FOR CONVENTION PLENARY**

- I. These rules and the National Constitution of CLUW shall prevail throughout the Convention. These rules may be suspended or amended by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates present.
- II. The Order of Business of the Convention shall be set forth in the official printed program so that delegates may be aware of the agenda.

#### III. PLENARY RULES

#### A. Microphones:

- 1. Microphones shall be numbered in order. There shall be six (6) microphones available for speakers on the floor.
- 2. The Chair shall call on speakers in a rotation of all microphones.
- 3. Delegates desiring to make a motion or speak on the question before the body must wait to be recognized by the Chair. The Sergeants-at-Arms will ensure delegates remain orderly while at the microphones and are informed of the microphone rules. The Sergeant-at-Arms will signal the Chair as to the purpose of the delegate at the microphone by holding up a color-coded card:

```
red card = privileged motions
yellow card = incidental motions
green card = subsidiary motions (including amendments)
```

4. Microphones shall be cleared after consideration of each question before the body.

## B. Recognition to Speak:

- 1. Only certified delegates may speak on the floor of the plenary.
- 2. Any delegate recognized by the Chair must state name, union, and chapter (if any) before speaking.
- 3. A delegate shall not be recognized to speak more than once on the same subject until all who desire to speak have had an opportunity to do so.
- 4. Any delegate, when called to order by the Chair, shall remain silent until the question on the floor is decided.

#### C. Motions and Amendments:

- 1. Every motion and amendment duly moved and seconded shall be repeated clearly to the convention body before it is open for discussion.
- 2. Every motion or amendment must be submitted to the Chair in writing.
- 3. Every motion or amendment that is to be voted upon must be repeated clearly to the convention body before it is voted upon.
- 4. The maker of a motion or amendment shall have the first opportunity to speak to it.
- 5. Total time for debate on each main motion (including resolutions and all amendments thereto) shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes.
- 6. If a delegate requests an extension of debate, the Chair shall immediately place it to a vote without debate. If carried by a majority vote, additional time of ten (10) minutes shall be allowed.
- 7. A delegate shall be allowed to speak for a period not to exceed three (3) minutes. She/he shall be notified when two (2) minutes have elapsed and again at the end of three (3)



- minutes, at which time the speaker must be seated.
- 8. The Chair shall allow at least two (2) delegates to speak on each side of any debatable question.
- 9. A motion to close debate or to table shall not be in order until there has been an opportunity for two (2) speakers on each side of the issue to speak to the original motion.

## **D. Voting Procedures:**

- 1. Voting shall be by voice or by a show of hands. However, the Chair may call for a standing vote to facilitate counting.
- 2. A motion for a roll call vote is neither debatable nor amendable and requires a forty percent (40%) vote of the delegates present to pass.
- 3. Show-of-hands or standing votes shall be tabulated by members of the Sergeants-at-Arms Committee.
- **E. Quorum:** Thirty percent (30%) of the registered delegates shall constitute a quorum.

## F. Appeals:

- 1. An appeal of the ruling of the Chair must be recognized before any other order of business.
- 2. A motion to overrule the decision of the Chair is not debatable and must carry a two-thirds (2/3) vote of delegates present.
- **G. Miscellaneous Motions:** The following motions are not debatable or amendable and take precedence over all other motions:
  - call for the question;
  - point of information;
  - point of order or procedure;
  - point of personal privilege.
- **H. No Smoking:** Because of health concerns, there shall be no cigarette smoking (including electronic cigarettes) in convention, workshop, or meeting rooms.
- I. Electronic Devices: All electronic devices must be turned off or <u>silenced</u> in convention, workshop, or meeting rooms. Violators will be subject to a fine of ten dollars (\$10.00) to be collected immediately by the Sergeants-at-Arms and deposited in the CLUW general fund. This rule does <u>not</u> apply to photography, texting, or note-taking when using a silenced electronic device. All phone conversations must be taken outside of convention, workshop, an meeting rooms. The chair shall remind delegates, guests, and observers of this rule at the beginning of each session.
- **J. Penalties for Non-Compliance:** Failure to comply with the above rules will result in the Sergeants-At-Arms escorting the delegate, observer, or guest from the convention, workshop, or meeting room.

- 1. <u>All resolutions must be related to one or more of the four goals of CLUW as stated in the CLUW Constitution:</u> participation of women in their unions, affirmative action in the workplace, organizing unorganized women and political action and legislation. Please note what goal (s) you are linking your resolution to.
- 2. All proposed resolutions must be submitted to the CLUW National President by mail, **Do Not Submit a PDF** (send flash drive and hard copy) or emailed as attachments in an MS Word document form.
- 3. Resolutions may be submitted by an individual member(s), standing committee, state president, chapter or the National Officers Council.
- Submissions by a standing committee **must be** signed by at least <u>one co-chair</u> of the committee. Submissions by a chapter or state **must be** signed by the chapter/state president.
- 4. Resolutions must include a contact person who can answer questions regarding the submission, should the resolutions committee need additional information.
- 5. Resolutions should include a title (which may be changed by the committee) and action items for CLUW implementation at the national, state or chapter levels, and as individual members, along with a suggested timeline for actions.
- 6. Documentation of statistics, relevant legislation or other statements of fact referenced in the resolution should be included copy of legislation, magazine articles, union publications, etc.
- 7. Resolutions should be submitted with background information made as statements of fact instead of "whereas" clauses and with **one** Resolved clause followed by your action items. (See format guide)


