The International Constitution Convention is coming up in July. You will be getting mailers in the fall to vote, so make sure you vote and send back in to international so your vote counts! Please do not write on ballots or they will not count. The contract is coming up so start thinking of what you would like to have changed in this next contract.

For Retirees that retired in the 90's, if you haven't called Met-Life and had them send you your proof of coverage and update your beneficiary's list, please do so. The number is (1-888-228-1811). For Retirees that are about to turn 65 Caterpillar ends your insurance the first day of the month of your 65th birthday. You need to come in 4-6 weeks prior to the month of your 65th birthday and see me. If you have any questions before then you can call me at 217-428-7706.

Things you will need to bring are the following items:

- 1.) Red, White and Blue Medicare Card
- 2.) Checkbook
- 3.) Copy of all medications, dosages and how many times a day you take that medication. You can have your pharmacy run a copy of that for you.
- 4.) What pharmacy you prefer to use.
- 5.) Doctors you use addresses and phone numbers.
- 6.) Dentist you use address and phone number.
- 7.) We will call VIA Benefits at (1-866-766-6087). It usually takes about 3-4 hours to complete.

Work Place Violence

Workplace violence is any act or threat of physical violence, harassment, intimidation, or other threatening disruptive behavior that occurs at the work site. It ranges from threats and verbal abuse to physical assaults and even homicide. It can affect and involve employees, clients, customers and visitors. Acts of violence and other injuries is currently the third-leading cause of fatal occupational injuries in the United States. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics Census of Fatal Occupational Injuries (CFOI), of the 5,333 fatal workplace injuries that occurred in the United States in 2019, 761 were cases of intentional injury by another person. However it manifests itself, workplace violence is a major concern for employers and employees nationwide.

Hello Union Brothers and Sisters what's the hot topic lately in the plant. We have been seeing a increased number of work place violence. Over the last few month's its has become a common issue in the plant an with companies zero tolerance stance it has posed a major issue right now. we don't know if it is because of the high temperatures or if it is because of people's frustration with everything going on in or outside of work. 
Interview Questions Are designed to help the interviewer understand the employees molivation for wanting to be a machinist and to gauge their engagement around career development at Caterpli
