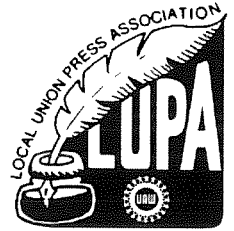

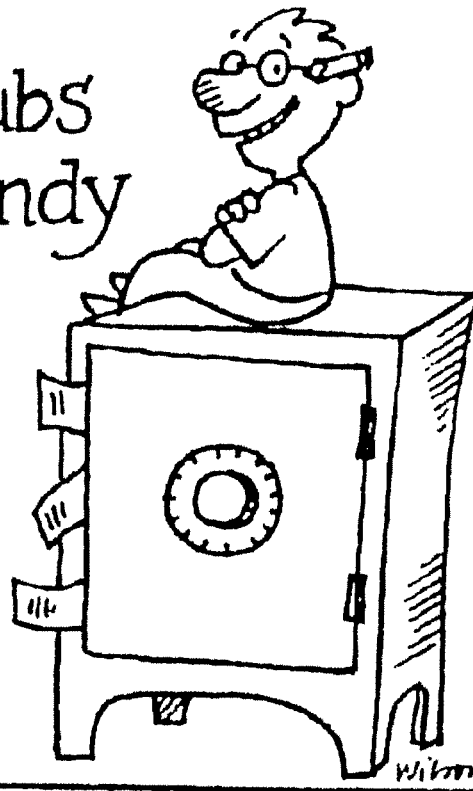

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I had the pleasure of lobbying at the State House at the end of February. With a group of several labor leaders, we were able to make our voices heard. You may have seen some of the coverage on our local news channels.

The legislature is proposing to roll back the child labor laws in Iowa. Here are some highlights of the bills; to expand the amount of hours that 14 year olds can work during the school year, to allow 16 and 17 year olds to sell and serve alcohol, to allow child labor in the mines. If that isn't enough, it removes nearly all liabilities from employers who employ a minor who is injured or permanently disabled on a job that is part of a "work-based learning" program. Contact your representatives and senators of Iowa and tell them "Our kids are not for sale!"

There are also several other bills going through the State House. It never ceases to amaze me that their big reason for funding for the private schools was so that "families could have a choice". Yet, they want to restrict other family's choices. I would like to thank the Iowa State CAP Council for sending me to Des Moines to lobby.

Spring is coming, so have a Happy St. Patrick's Day and I have heard that the Easter Bunny will be back for a visit.

These vehicles are made in the United States or Canada by members of the UAW and Canada's Unifor union, formerly the Canadian Auto Workers (CAW). Because of the integration of vehicle production in both countries, all of the vehicles listed as made in Canada include significant UAW-made content and support the jobs of UAW members.

Vehicles marked with a single asterisk [*] are also produced in Mexico.

When purchasing a vehicle marked with a single asterisk, it's important to check the Vehicle Identification Number (VIN). A VIN beginning with "1" or "4" or "5" identifies a U.S.-made vehicle; a "2" identifies a Canadian-made vehicle; a "3" identifies a vehicle made in Mexico. Not all vehicles made in the United States or Canada are built by union-represented workers. Vehicles not listed here, even if produced in the United States or Canada, are not union-made.
