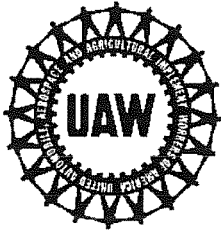

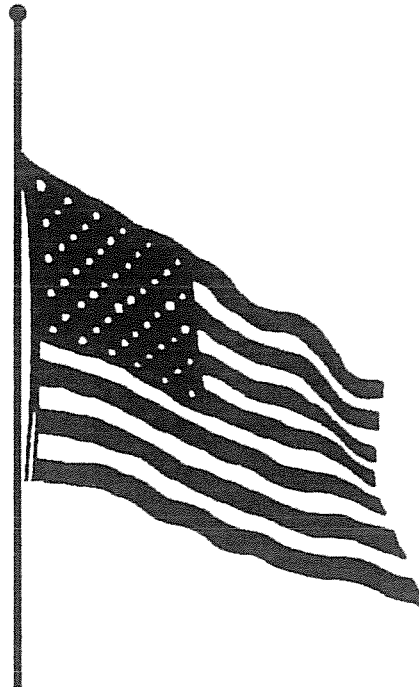

38th Constitutional Convention Delegates Notice of Nominations and Elections

Nominations and Elections will be taken for Delegates to the UAW 38th Constitutional Convention, which will be held July 25-28, 2022 in Detroit, Michigan.

Anyone who has been a member in good standing for 12 months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (in this case July 1st 2022) and a member in good standing of this Local Union for 3 months immediately preceding the first day of the month in which the Convention is held (in this case April 1st 2022) is eligible to run as a Delegate.

Those nominated and not present at these meetings will have three (3) working days to accept in writing to a member of their Election Committee or at the UAW Office.

The two (2) top vote-getters of each Election will serve as Delegates. The next two (2) top vote-getters will serve as 1st and 2nd Alternates in the event the Delegates cannot attend.

With proper notice the Election Polling Times will be extended if overtime is scheduled.

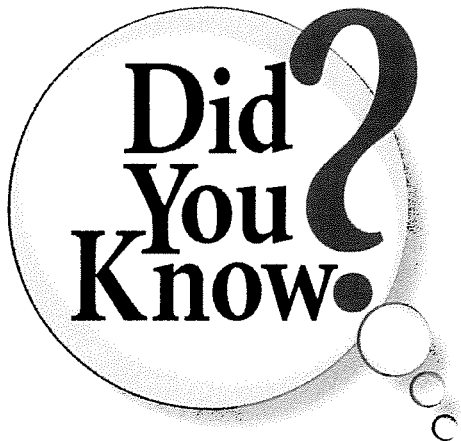

Region 4 Retiree Workers Council Meeting

On April 19-21, 2022, we attended the Council meeting in Ottawa, Illinois. The Region 4 Assistant Director opened the meeting with a report on the referendum vote we were all asked to vote on for how we would elect our National Executive Board in the future. Of all the ballots sent out, they received 10% back. Of that 10%, 60% voted to have one ballot for each member to vote for our next International Executive Board. They are still waiting on what the new guidelines will be for our new election process.

We heard from a representative from the Illinois Alliance & Retired Americans (ARA) on legislation being introduced to help American workers and retirees. There is a national website to visit. It is www.illinoisretiredamericans.org.

Ron McInroy, Region 4 Director, spoke to us. They are working on policies. Setting rules for now and in the future procedures.
