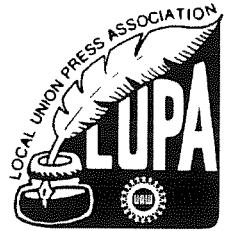

Walter and May Reuther Family Scholarship Program

Applications for this year's Family Scholarship Program in Black Lake, Michigan are available at the UAW Hall.

You are eligible to apply for a Scholarship if you are a UAW member in good standing for one year and have not participated in the Program in the past. The deadline to apply is June 1st, 2023.

This family scholarship program is a wonderful opportunity for members and their families to learn more about their union in a fun and relaxing atmosphere. The only expense for most families is their time, as the International Union pays for meals, transportation, and lodging.

All active or laid-off UAW members in good standing is eligible to apply for the Family Scholarship Program if they have never attended the program before. You must be willing to use your regular vacation, personal leave, or union leave time (where permitted by contract) to attend. Your spouse/domestic partner (must reside at the same address) and children 4-18 years old may attend with you and must participate in all scheduled workshops and programs.

The 1-week session is July 23-28, 2023.

Casual clothes are acceptable everywhere from classes to meals to the ballfield.
