

After long thought and weighing of the good and bad, I have decided it is time to move on.


It was a difficult decision on my part. Being the Editor is something I honestly enjoyed doing, although most months it's a struggle to find material to fill the pages.



DO BUY UNION-MADE TIRES

USW MADE TIRES

The U.S. Department of Transportation requires that all tires sold in the United States carry a code which shows. among other things, the company and plant that made the tire. The code would look like this: DOT BE XX XXX XXX The two symbols (either two letters or a letter and a number) which follow "DOT" indicate the company and the plant where a tire was manufactured. For example, the above code indicates a tire made by B. F. Goodrich in fuscaloosa, AL. The following is a listing of all U.S. and Canadian unionized tire plants and their DOT codes. By comparing this list to the code on the tire you are buying, you can be certain you are getting a USW made tire.
