Our Brothers and Sisters from Local 997 in Newton have ratified a new agreement with Thombert. They have all returned to work.


I would like to take time to thank Kelly Tompkins for his service as the Editor for our local. He served in this position for several years. He has decided to move on. Thank you, Hoss!!





IOWA KIDS ARE NOT FOR SALE

In February UAW lowa State CAP joined union workers across the state of lowa in Des Moines to protest the loosening of child labor laws. Efforts in several states are led by Republican Legislators to address worker shortages. Child welfare advocates and labor leaders remain concerned that hard-won protections for minors are being diminished, as according to data from the U.S. Labor Department, child labor violations have been increasing since 2015. Investigators of the Wage and Labor Division are finding more children working in dangerous jobs, including meatpacking and metal shops. Senator Nate Boulton and other lowa CAP supported Legislators are planning to enhance education and fact sheets so that parents and employers can make better decisions about teenagers' employment in the state, revisiting state and federal laws for consistency in the next session.
